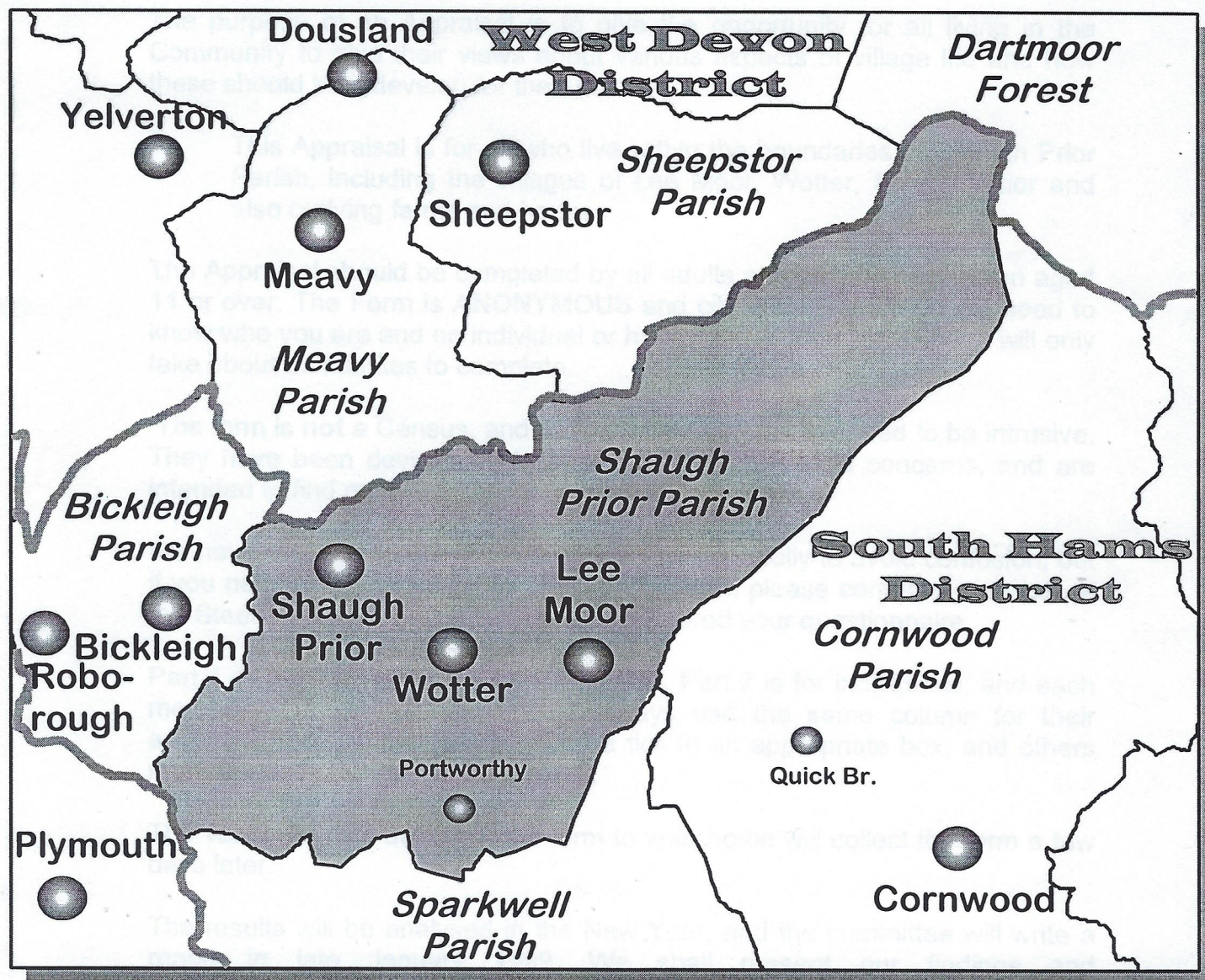

Appraisal 1998

After a Public Meeting in June this year it was decided to compose an Appraisal for Shaugh Prior Parish, and a Steering Group, made up of local people, was formed to take the process forward and devise a questionnaire.

The purpose of an Appraisal is to give the opportunity for all living in the Community to give their views about various aspects of village life and how these should best develop for the future.

This Appraisal is for all who live within the boundaries of Shaugh Prior Parish, including the villages of Lee Moor, Wotter, Shaugh Prior and also outlying farms and houses.

The Appraisal should be completed by all adults and also by all children aged 11 or over. The Form is **ANONYMOUS** and confidential – we do not need to know who you are and no individual or household can be identified. It will only take about 25 minutes to complete.

The form is **not** a Census, and the questions are not intended to be intrusive. They have been devised by local people to match local concerns, and are intended to find out what YOU think about local issues.

We have considered the wording of questions carefully to avoid confusion, but if you need help or assistance filling in the form, please contact a member of the Steering Group, or the person who delivered your questionnaire.

Part 1 of the form gives household details. Part 2 is for individuals, and each member of the household should always use the same column for their answers. Some questions just need a tick in an appropriate box, and others require a code number to be entered.

The volunteer who delivered the form to your home will collect the form a few days later.

The results will be analysed in the New Year, and the committee will write a report in late January 1999. We shall present our findings and recommendations based on your answers in February.

We hope you enjoy making a contribution to community life, and thank you very much for your help and co-operation.

The person who completed Part 1: Household section should ALWAYS put their answers in column A, the next person should ALWAYS put their answers in column B, the next person ALWAYS in column C and so on. The following example is for a household with 4 people aged 11 or more - note that some questions, like this example, ask for a coded reply - most just ask for ticks.
